The Memorial is located in a beautiful area, set aside on the west end of the lake at Camp Sapphire. The beautiful monument, with an appropriate bronze plaque on it, contains a dedication and the names of all of our employees who lost their lives in World War II. Immediately behind this Memorial will be erected a flag pole which will be the official flag of Camp Sapphire during the summer months.

## BOYS COACHING SCHOOL


Under the direction of Jack Alexander and a capable staff, this popular activity will open July 12 and will continue on Monday, Wednesday and Fridays until August 20. Starting time is 9:30. a. m. Boys from 7-15 invited. Emphasis is placed on swimming, calisthenics, and major sports---baseball, softball, tennis, etc. Enrollments expected to equal or exceed last year's record of 150.
