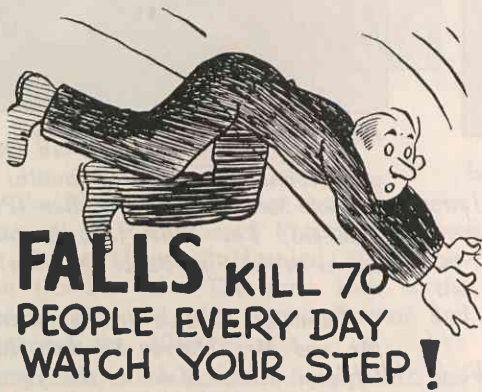


Safety for
