RED CROSS THANKS CONTRIBUTORS

A letter of thanks has been received by The Echo from the local Red Cross Roll Call leaders, Jerry Jerome and C. M. Douglas, and also from Chairman Lewis P. Hamlin, thanking Ecusta, Endless Belt, and their employees for the generous donation made to the 1949 roll call.

With a county quota of \$2,715, the chapter officially states that Ecusta employees donated a total of \$1,145.91, which amount was matched by the management. \$2,141.82 was sent to the local chapter, which was 78.8 percent of the entire chapter allotment, and \$150 was sent to the Henderson County chapter, making a grand total for 1949 of \$2,291.82.
