Back in the days of the bustle, the Prince Albert Coat, and the ox cart, Toxaway Inn was flourishing as one of the most famous and fashionable resorts in Eastern America. The estate com-prised some 30,000 acres in Transylvania and Jackson counties, 500 acres of which were covered by the waters of the large lake. The huge inn, which was recently razed, was one of the show places in this area, and many famous people went there to rest and play and enjoy the natural beauty of the mountains.

The Toxaway Mining Company had been in operation for several years, when in 1891 they built Fairfield Inn and the dam for Fairfield Lake. This inn became so popular that it was
