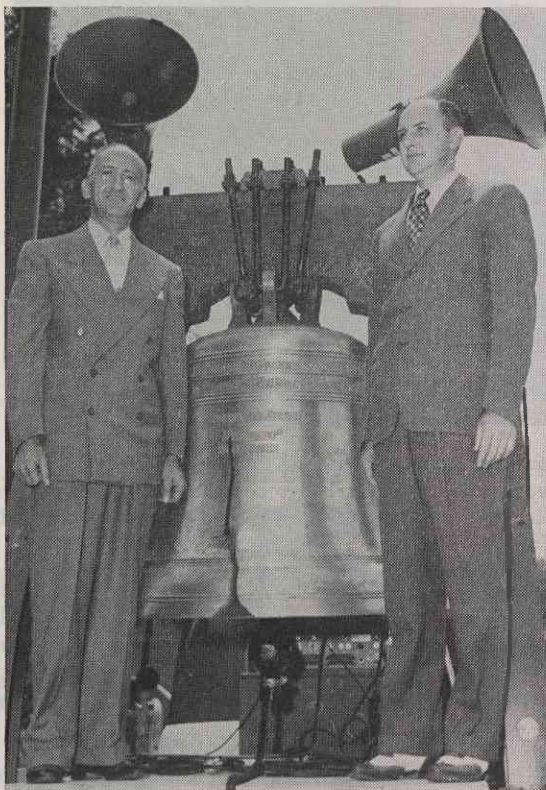




Recent Visitors
