COMMISSION REGULATIONS & ABSTRACTS OF IMPORTANT LAWS GOVERNING HUNTING IN THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

Effective August 1, 1950 to July 31, 1951.

COMMISSION REGULATIONS

- A. Open Seasons and Bag Limits on Game Species. (All dates are inclusive except for Sundays.)
 - 1. BEAR
 - a. Open Season:
 October 16—January 1.
 Exceptions:
 In Transylvania County, bear may not be taken from November 20 through December 9.
 - b. Bag Limits: Daily, 2; Possession, 2; Season, None.
 - 2. DEER (White-tail).
 Only male deer with visible antlers may be taken.
 - a. Open Season:
 November 20—December 9 in:
 Buncombe, Haywood, Henderson, Jack-

son, and Transylvania Counties.

b. Bag Limits: Daily, 1; Possession, 1; Season, 2.

- 3. ELK
 - a. Open Season: None.

4. RUSSIAN WILD BOAR

- a. Open Season:
 October 16—January 1 in:
 Cherokee, Clay and Graham Counties.
- b. Bag Limits:
 Daily, 1; Possession, 2; Season, 2.
- 5. RACCOON AND OPOSSUM (with dogs and guns)
 - a. Open Season:
 October 16—February 15.
 - Bag Limits:
 Daily, None; Possession, None; Season,
 None.
- 6. RABBITS
 - a. Open Season:
 November 23—January 31.
 - b. Bag Limits: Daily, 5; Possession, 10; Season, 75.
- 7. SQUIRREL
 - a. Open Season:
 October 16—January 1.
 - b. Bag Limits: Daily, 8; Possession, 16; Season, 100.
- 8. QUAIL (Bobwhite)
 - a. Open Season:November 23—January 31.
 - b. Bag Limits: Daily, 8; Possession, 16; Season, 100.
- 9. WILD TURKEYS (Gobblers or Toms only)
 - a. Open Season:
 November 23—January 31.
 - b. Bag Limits: Daily, 1; Possession, 2; Season, 3.
- 10. RUFFED GROUSE
 - a. Open Season:
 November 23—January 31.
 Exception:
 In and west of Mitchell, McDowell and Henderson Counties the open season is November 1—January 31.
 - b. Bag Limits:
 Daily, 2; Possession, 4; Season 12.
 Exception:
