In the Doubles Event four Ecusta teams were among the eight winners. Arthur Owen and Jim Bradley were fourth with 1178 pins; L. C. Poor and Richard Landreth sixth with 1165 pins; Ernest Bradley and Felix Weese seventh with 1164 pins, and Howard Schmidt and Lloyd Harris were eighth with 1161 pins. Richard Landreth took the high game honors in this event with a 249 pin game.

Felix Weese won first place in the Singles Event with a total of 693 pins. His teammate, Arthur Owen, finished in second place with a 644 pin total. Other winners were Clyde Galloway fifth with 602 pins; sixth Ernest Burch with 596 pins; twelfth Jim Bradley 577 pins and thirteenth John Brewer with 575 pins. Arthur Owen bowled the high game in this event which totaled 238 pins. This was a handicap tournament and all scores include handicaps.
