Congratulations to Ray Wike. "Papa" Wike is the proud possessor of his first son, born November 8, 1951.

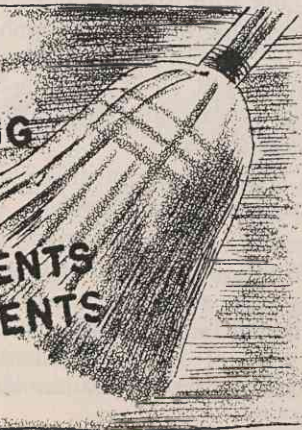
Welcome to two new members of the Tech Section, James Henson and Dick Talley.
