

Mr. Guffee built his home (top, left) in 1917, facing the old highway. When the highway was relocated, it ran on the other side of the house so he built a porch on the back, moved his living room, and now it faces the highway again.

This stone (top, right) marks his property line on the south. He moved it from its original position (about 20 feet away) when he bought the property in 1917. The stone is dated 1797 and is marked PL on one side and ZC on the other. It originally was a marker for the property of

Zack Candler. It also marked the line between Pickens County, S. C. and Buncombe County, N. C.
