Check your tires for good tread depth, essential for safe driving in all kinds of weather. Also check for uneven tread wear, cuts, or other defects which might spell trouble later. Proper tire inflation is an absolute must, too.

↓
Be sure the headlights, taillights and brake lights are in proper working order. Have a friend turn on head and parking lights and step on brake pedal while you check to see that lamps are in working order. Defective lighting could mean the difference between life and death.

Tire chains, a box of coarse sand and a small shovel should be kept in the trunk. You might drive for a month without needing them, but you'll be glad you have them when the roads are slippery. It's a good idea to check that spare tire occasionally, too. Also a properly operating jack, lug wrench and a screwdriver should be standard trunk equipment.

FOR ADDED SAFETY, CHECK THESE ITEMS

— windshield wipers — window glass — horn —
brakes — exhaust and muffler systems — wheel
alignment — steering — generator — battery.
