


CHARLES LINK STARS IN WNC TOURNEY OTHER ECUSTANS AMONG WINNERS

Charles Link, captain of the Cello-Mecks took first place in the All Events of the 17th annual WNC Ten Pin Bowling Tournament, which was held in Asheville recently.

Link also led his Cello-Meck team to second place honors in the team event with a team total of 3073 pins. The first place hoonrs went to Mable's Lunch team with a total of 3180 pins. Incidentally one Ecustan, Jim Metcalf of the Transportation Department is a member of this team.

In the doubles event Charles Link and his partner Jack Bryson placed eighth with a total of 1217 pins. However, Lewis Meece and Chris Rogers co-captains of Ecusta's WNC team placed second in this event with a total of 1251 pins. Four other pairs of Ecustans placed among the fifteen winners of the doubles event.

In the singles event Ecustans dominated ten of the twenty-nine prize winning places. Charles Link, Ecusta's star of the tourney came in second with a score of 684 pins.

In capturing first place in the All Events Charles amassed a total of 1926 pins, 35 pins ahead of his nearest contender. It is interesting to note that
