SIDETRACKS

A COMMA BUILT A RAILROAD—A railroad was once financed by a comma!

The old Culver Line was constructed by a firm of lawyers with the proceeds from a misplaced comma in the Tariff Act of June 6, 1872. The fatal line read: "Fruit, plants, tropical and semi-tropical for the purpose of propagation and cultivation . . ."

The typist made an error, striking a comma instead of a hyphen after "Fruit". The lawyers spotted the error and sued the United States Treasury, acting for a group of fruit importers, and collected over \$3,000,000 in tariff refunds! The old Culver Line, extending from Brooklyn to Coney Island, may never have been built if it had not been for the world's most expensive misplaced comma.
