## **D. W. PETERS AND J. T. PRESCOTT APPOINTMENTS ANNOUNCED**

D. W. Peters has been appointed Wage and Salary Administrator of Olin Industries, and J. T. Prescott has been named Personnel Assistant. The appointments were announced by John E. Gagnon, Olin's Director of Personnel.

Peters has been Wage and Salary Supervisor in the Industrial Relations Department of the Ecusta Paper Corporation, a subsidiary of Olin at Pisgah Forest, North Carolina. ## **EXPANSION OF METALS DIVISION TO COST \$5,500,000**
