Dr. Mac Roy Gasque, Medical Director of the Ecusta Paper Corporation at Pisgah Forest, reported for active duty to the Naval Air Station at Alameda, California on December 15.

A native of Asheville, Dr. Gasque served 38 months in the U. S. Navy Medical Corps during World War II. Almost all of his active service was aboard the U.S.S. Wyoming.
