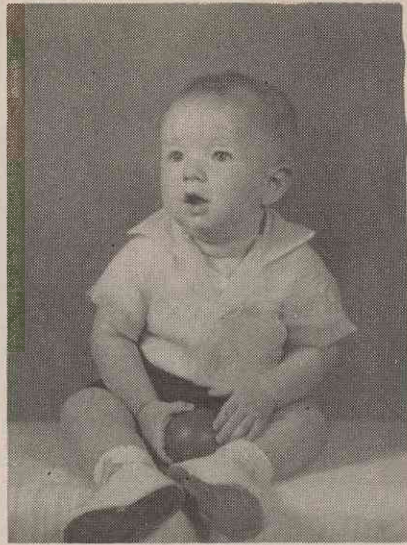
Charles and Gaynell Brewer took a short vacation to see Charlie's mother in the eastern part of the state and to take a few dips in the surf at Wrightsville Beach.
