NEW CELLOPHANE PLANT TO BE AT OLIN, INDIANA

Olin is the name selected for the site of the new cellophane plant to be constructed in Indiana by Olin Mathieson Chemical Corporation. The plant itself will be known as The Olin Works. This announcement was made by N. H. Collisson,

vice president for operations.

The site was formerly known as Kern and is about ten miles east of Danville, Ill., and two miles west of Covington, Ind., on the west bank of the Wabash river. It is on the Peoria and Eastern Division of the New York Central System.
