BLOOD BANK NOTES

Due to some recent misunderstanding of the Red Cross Blood program, all employees should take note of the following two items:

1. Only members of an employee's immediate family is eligible for blood from the Red Cross Blood Bank under the terms stipulated on the Blood Donor certificate. Persons who are not members of an employee's immediate family (husband or wife, dependent children, dependent parents) and not covered by another certificate must either *pay for blood* or *get donors outside the program*.

2. Ecusta employees, or members of their immediate family who need blood and are in hospitals *outside* of the Asheville district should contact the Medical Center or the Personnel department.
