MIC Formed

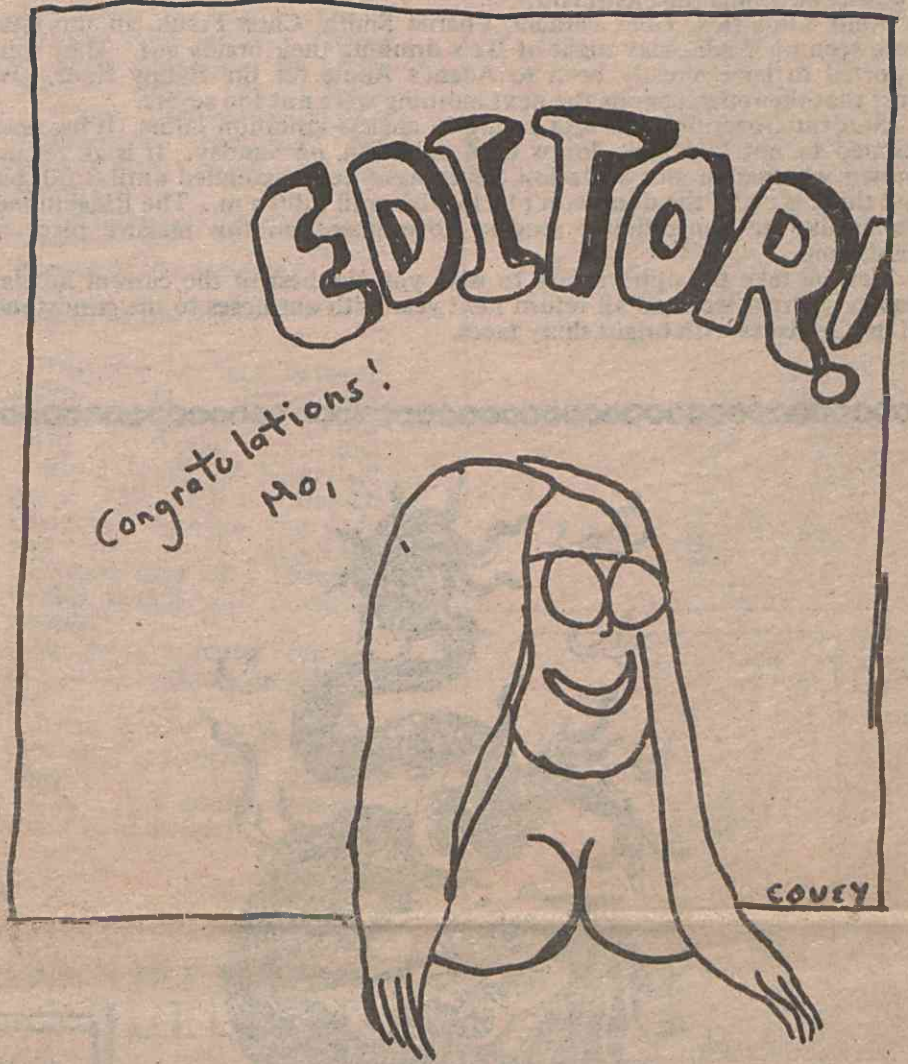

Dr. Milton Ready, associate professor of history and chairman of the history department, has recently published an economic history of Georgia which covers the period of 1732 to 1754. His book, *The Castle Builders*, is a revision of his doctoral dissertation which was done while a graduate student at the University of Georgia at Athens. The book deals with failure of colonial America's "Last Utopia" - Georgia - because philanthropists in London directed the affairs in Savannah from 3,000 miles away.
