The NSPA Annual Scholarship Award

Who can apply? Students majoring in accounting with a "B" or better grade point average. Students enrolled full-time in a degree program at an accredited two-year or four-year college or university. Evening program studies will be considered full-time if they are pursuing an accounting degree. Only undergraduate students are eligible. Only U.S. or Canadian citizens attending an accredited business school, college or university may apply.

When to Apply: Students in an accredited two-year college may apply during their first year or during their second year if transferring to a four-year institution, provided they have committed themselves to a major in accounting throughout the remainder of their college career.

How to Apply: Applications and appraisal forms may be obtained from your school or by writing the NSPA Scholarship Foundation at 1010 North Fairfax Street, Alexandria VA 22314-1574, or calling 703-549-6400, or faxing 703-549-2984.

The **James Madison Memorial Fellowship Foundation** awards fellowships to future and current secondary school teachers of American history, American government, or social studies in grades 7-12 to support their graduate study of the roots, principles, framing, and development of the U.S. Constitution.

The foundation awards James Madison Fellowships to college seniors and college graduates without teaching experience (Junior Fellows) and to experienced secondary school teachers in grades 7-12 (Senior Fellows) who will normally enroll, respectively, in full-time and part-time graduate study leading to one of the following master's degrees listed in the order of the

Foundation's preferability. A Master's degree in history or political science; A degree of Master of Arts in teaching in history or social studies; or A related master's degree in education that permits a concentration in history, government, social studies, or political science. Each fellowship recipient must take at least 12 semester hours or the equivalent in topics directly related to the framing and history of the Constitution of the United States.

The purpose of the **Richard Goolsby Scholarship Fund** is to provide college scholarships to students who have shown a career interest or demonstrated practical experience in the plastics industry.
