The UNCA men's baskerball team extended their winning streak to three with their first road win of the sesson, 76-61, at Charleston Southern on Feb. 23. The Bulldogs were then cut down at Winthrop University on Feb. 27 with a score of 90-50 in their last game of the regular season before the Big South Townsparen.
