Volley Ball Dropped

The Women's Intercollegiate Volleyball program will be discontinued at UNC-A this year because construction work on the roof of Justice Gym has made it impossible to practice on the courts.

Women's Athletic Director Bobbie Quinn said it has not been possible to arrange practice facilities off campus.

"We will be actively recruiting players for next year's team," Quinn said. UNC-A's team will be competing again next year with colleges and universities in North Carolina and other states."

Be Fitter

FINANCIAL HELP

College seniors who are receiving financial aid or support themselves are eligible for a waiver of the basic GRE test fee if their parents contribute \$200 or less to their senior year of study.

The waiver is \$14 for the aptitude test or the advanced test and \$28 for both.

Students who enlist in specific units of the National Guard or Reserve are eligible for financial assistance through the National Guard and Reserve Educational Assistance program.

The plan can provide up to half the student's undergraduate educational expenses. A maximum of \$500 in any 12-month period for a total of \$2,000 to help cover tuition, fees, books, laboratory and shop fees and consumable materials used in class will be paid to students in the Guard or Reserve.

The offer applies to units of the Army National Guard, Army Reserve, Marine Corps Reserve, Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve. More information may be obtained from local Guard or Reserve units.
