Thomas Hood:

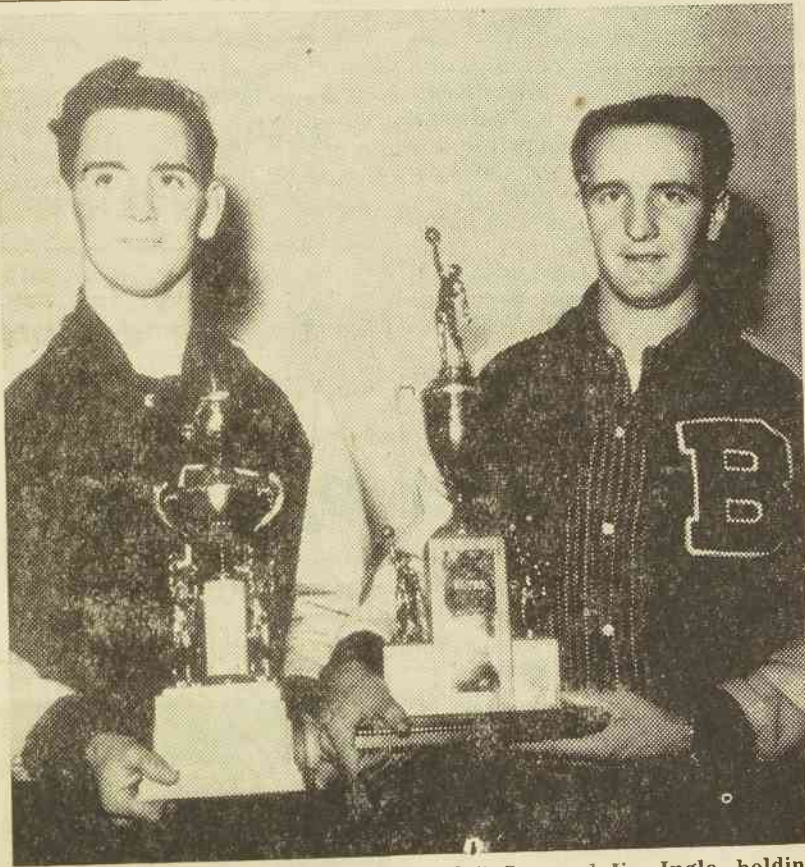
My temples throb, my pulses boff,

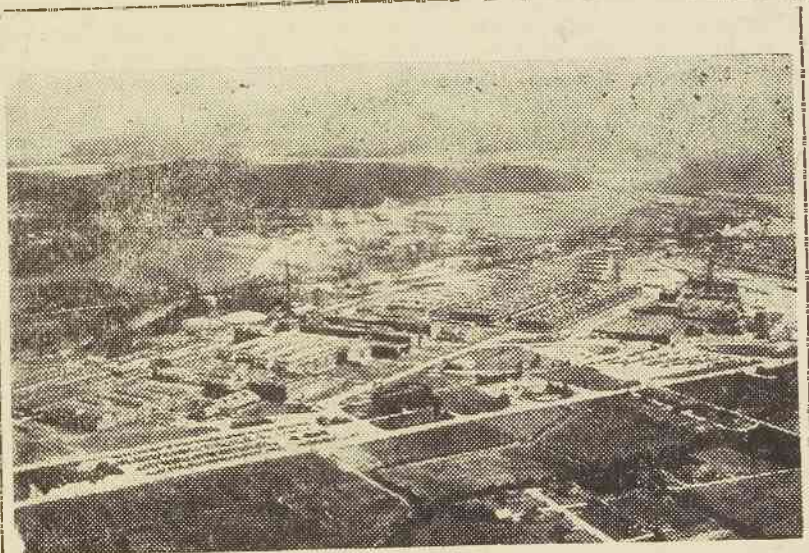
