Brevard College is fortunate indeed to have two such outstanding men as speakers for commencement. Dr. W. Mark Depp will preach the baccalaureate sermon at 11:00, June 2; N. H. Collisson will deliver the commencement address at 3:30.

Dr. Mark Depp was born in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. He is a graduate of Allegheny College and Boston University School of Theology. He received his homorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Allegheny College. After graduating from the School of Theology, he entered the Baltimore Conference and served several churches in Virginia, Maryland, and the District of Columbia. Also, he was an army chaplain in World War I. Some of the larger churches Da Depp has served are St. Mark's m Baltimore, Calvary Church in Washington, and Christ church Pittsburgh.
