We hope participation will be 100 percent and that those, if any, who are unable to play, will be watching and cheering their team from the sidelines.

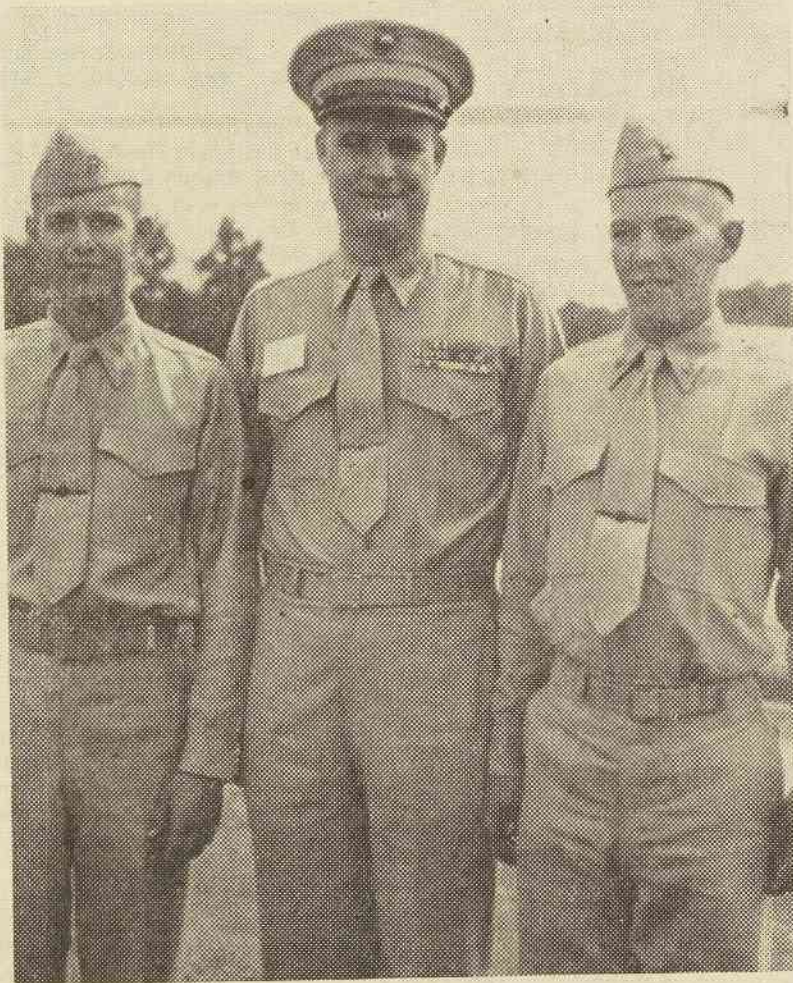
Women's Athletic Program Being Mapped Out
