## Brevard Routes Hiawasse 73-59

The red hot Brevard Tornados romped on to their fifth victory in their last six games by downing Hiawasse 73-59. The Tennessee team trailed throughout the entire game and were unable to cope with the rebounding ability of U. B. Deyton and Wayne Cordell. Not even their sharp shooting accuracy from outside the foul circle could keep them in the game.

Kent Laughter played his best game since the opening of the season, hitting for 17 points. Forward Lloyd Hensley also hit for 17. The team's newest addition, Jim Huffman, of Marion, N. C., hit the scoring column for the first time with 4 points. His superior faking and foot work were a pleasure to see. Other scoring were as follows: Cordell, 11; Forbes, 6; Dayton, 6; Livingston, 5; Van Horn, 4; and Wilson, 3.

## Tornadoes Upset Young Harris 82-75

The Brevard Tornados pulled off one of the league's biggest upsets here as they ripped through the Young Harris' defense and topped the highly rated Georgia squad 82-75. In knocking off Young Harris, Brevard was defeating last year's Georgia State Champions.

Brevard showed one of the finest team efforts we have seen, with each of the starting players scoring in double figures. The two teams played a see-saw battle throughout the first half leaving the score knotted at 39-39 as the half ended.

Brevard's attack was led by Lloyd Hensley, who racked up 27 points. U. B. Deyton and Wayne Cordell hit for 16 and 14 respectively, while guards Don Livingston and Kent Laughter each hit for 10 markers.

Wayne (Potsy) Cordell was personally responsible for 8 of the teams first 13 points, and he had 12 points at the end of the first quarter.

## Mars Hill Edges Brevard 69-65

The snow failed, but the Mars Hill basketball five successfully turned back the Brevard College Tornados Saturday night at Mars Hill. After journeying 50 miles, half way in snow, ice and sleet,

Brevard met defeat, their second in their last seven games. The Tornados, who went into the game with 8 wins, 7 losses, were unable to dump in the 4 points necessary to pull the game out five, and the game ended with Brevard behind by the slim margin of 4 points.

Brevard, who defeated Mars Hill in their first outing, held the lead several times early in the second half, but failed to keep pace as the game came down to the finish.

Lloyd Hensley, averaging better than 20 points, upped his average by dunking in 25 points. John Van Horn sank 11; Don Livingston netted 9, and U. B. Deyton hit for 8 markers.

United States unit of the Federation, the United Student Christian Council. As Mr. Maury explained at a luncheon sponsored by the Department of Student Work of the Board of Missions: "It is the intent of this program to effect a real change in the present student generation in order to lead more students to volunteer as full-time workers in the church's world wide missions." The key event, which will draw 350 students from the Federation's members units and 100 other students, will be a major world teaching conference in Britain in 1960. Following the international conference a series of regional teaching-study conferences will be held. The purpose of the program is fourfold, Mr. Maury said, to:

1. Re-think the responsibility of the church in the present world situation on the basis of the Biblical revelation and the lessons of church history.
2. Recover and communicate to this student generation a new and more adequate understanding of the basic motivation for the mission of the church and commitment to it.
3. Train students and young leaders in the mission of the church today.
4. Help them to find their place of service within the total life and mission of the church.
