Thomas Cousins, gained much information that will be applicable to the local group at present and in the future. This is the first time this particular conference has had a representation from our school. It is hoped that this will be an annual event in the program here at Brevard College.

Twenty-three other colleges and universities in the state were represented. At the general session a panel composed of members from Duke, Salem, Wake Forest, Elon, and Mars Hill, discussed "Intramurals — Means of Motivation and Values Gained."

This was followed by group discussions in three areas: Awards for the Intramural Program, Recent Trends in the Intramural Program, and Tournaments for the Intramural Program. A member of Brevard's delegation was present in each group.
