Many Events Will Be Highlights As 1960-61 Year Ends

The 1961 Commencement Weekend will be filled with interesting and varied activities for the graduating class, their parents and guests, alumni, faculty members, and the administration.

The program begins on Friday, May 26, with a Victory-Over-Exams party given for the graduates by Dean and Mrs. J. B. Bennett. Then following rehearsal and preparation for commencement services on Saturday morning at 10:30 in the Methodist Church, the Brevard College Alumni Association will honor the graduates with a luncheon at 1 p. m. in the college cafeteria.

At 8 p. m. Saturday night, the Glee Club, Madrigal singers, and Wind Ensemble will be presented in the annual Commencement concert in the Campus Center Building Auditorium.

On Sunday, May 28, at 11 a. m. in the Methodist Church, Dr. Lee F. Tuttle will deliver the Commencement sermon.

At 3:45 p. m., prior to graduation, a recital will be given on the Carillon bells.

At 4 p. m., graduation exercises will be held for the 1961 graduating class in the Campus Center Building Auditorium. Principal speakers for the afternoon will be Dr. Lester F. Zerfoss, director of Industrial Relations and Management services for American Enka corporation, and Dr. Emmett K. McLarty, Jr., president of Brevard College. Dr. John B. Bennett, academic dean, will present the honors and awards and announce the honor roll and Dean's List.

Dr. Bennett and Dr. McLarty will then award the Associate in Arts degrees and Junior College Diplomas to the graduating class.

A reception for the graduates will be held immediately following the exercises in the faculty lounge.

Dr. C. Edward Roy, college marshal, and the freshmen marshals will usher and lead the processions at the commencement service and graduation exercises.
