386 Students Enrolled For Fall Semester

With registration completed, statistics reveal that 386 students have enrolled at Brevard Junior College for the 1961-62 term. Of the 386, 197 are men and 189 are women. Fifteen states including North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Maryland, Georgia, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Florida, New York, Connecticut, Illinois, Kentucky, Tennessee, Ohio, and the District of Columbia are represented.

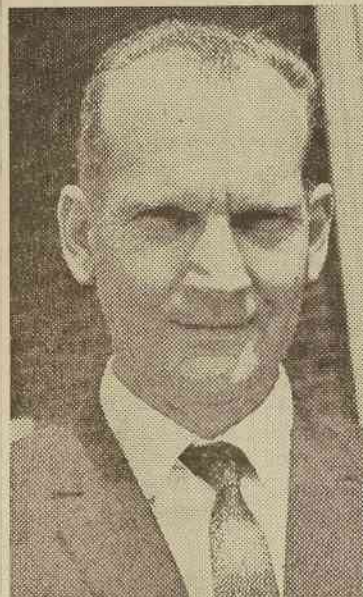
Also composed in the student body are representatives from Cuba, Panama, Sarawak, Jordan, and Venezuela. The enrollment of new students into the student body surpasses by 100 the number of returning students. In addition, many students have been enrolled for special courses.
