

Blood Unit To Visit Brevard

Students And Citizens Are Urged To Give

The Bloodmobile of the American National Red Cross will be accessible to the students of Brevard College on Tuesday, November 14. It will be located at the Brevard Methodist Church across from the campus entrance. The hours will be from 11:30 - 1:30, and from 2:00 - 5:00.

Those who give blood receive a donor's card which entitles them and their family to free blood should the need for it arise. The Asheville blood bank has arrangements whereby the holder of a donor card here may receive blood in any part of the United States.

The local Red Cross chapter urges college and the local citizens to give liberally. Students under twenty - one must have written permission from their parents to give blood.

III. Animal wisdom speaks irresistibly of a good creator who infused instincts into otherwise helpless little creatures.

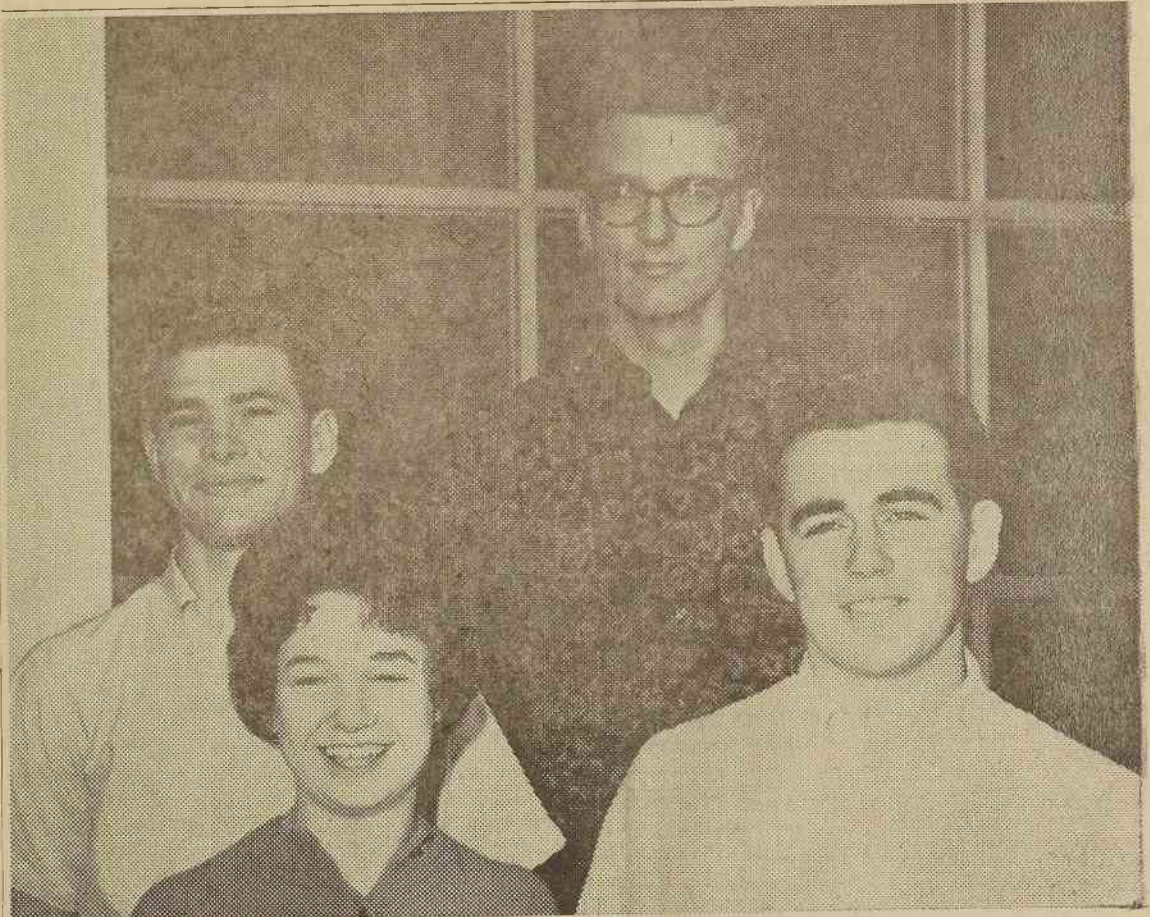
IV. Man has something more than instincts — the power of reason.
