The new catalogue is arranged in such a manner as to eliminate any inconvenience which might confront a prospective student seeking to attain facts or points of interest concerning Brevard. The printing type has been enlarged, and the spacing has been made more profound and decorative for easier reading.

On the back-side of the front cover appears a Correspondence Directory to aid prospective students in their questions concerning Admissions and Scholarships, Academic Program, Student Interests, Business Matters, Alumni Affairs, and Administrative Affairs. On the first page is given an accreditation of Brevard College. On the second page is found the Table of Contents which gives aids of locations concerning such items as an invitation to prospective students, the college calendar, the Promise, Program, and Advantages of Brevard College and the College Community, Admissions procedure, Academic requirements, Curricula, Courses of instruction, Officers 1961-62, and the Student Directory.
