In 1956, the Clarion sponsored a poll to determine the opinion of the student body of Brevard College on the subject of integration. At that time a majority of the student body opposed integration.

The purpose of the April poll will be to show the change in opinion during the past six years, if any. There will be four choices: (1) Actively for; (2) For, but not willing to engage actively; (3) Against, but unwilling to be actively engaged in the issue; (4) Actively against.
