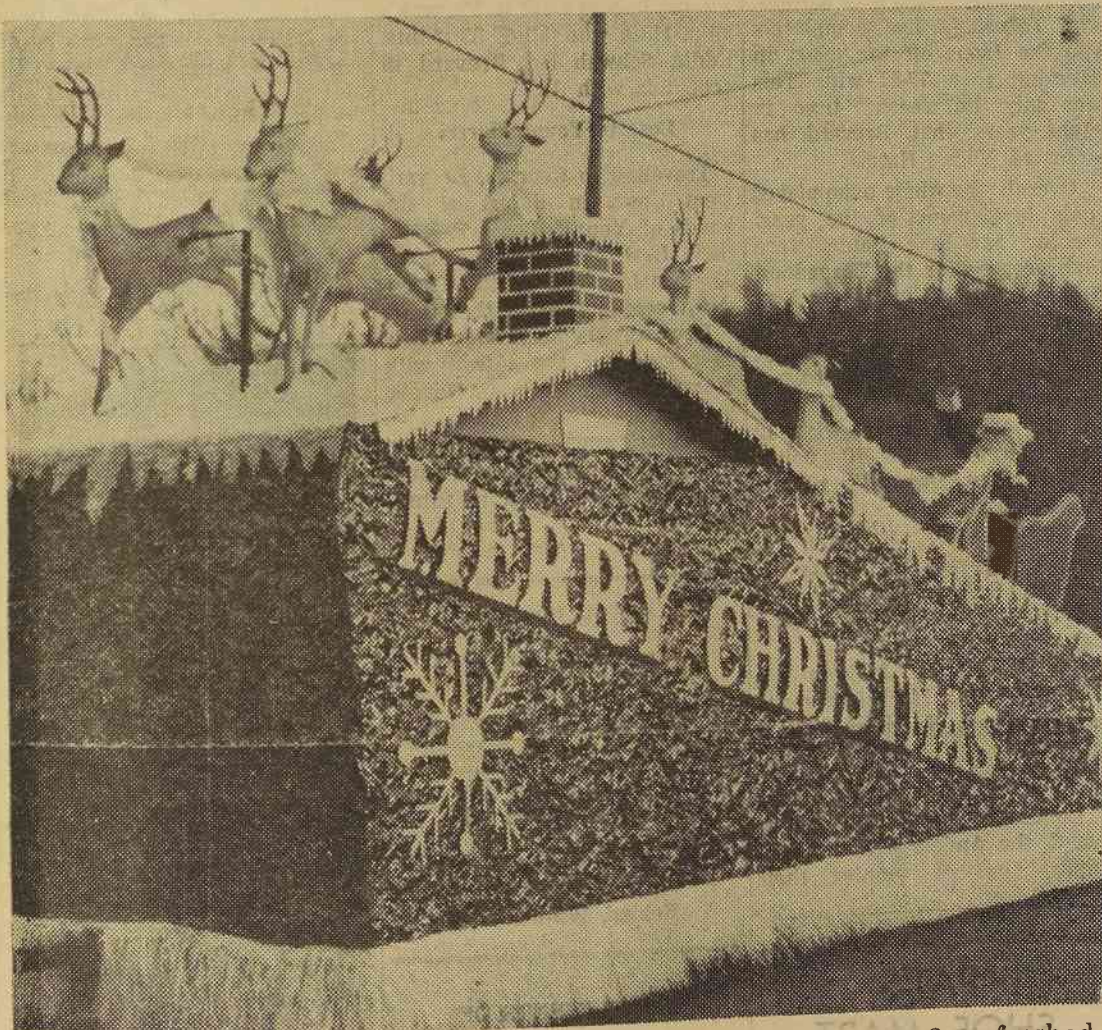
The Clisophic society sponsored a dance Saturday night
