The powerful thinclads of Brevard College with Coach Thad Talley at the controls has begun what is expected to be the best season in the school's history.

On March 23, the team journeyed to Furman University and the highly competitive News - Piedmont Relays. Although there were no team winners declared, the mighty men of B. C. finished in first place, outscoring Johnson C. Smith College by 1/2 point. However, Coach Talley was very disappointed with individual performances.

"I felt that we could have done a lot better. The competition was keen, but we still should have done better. We did not win a single first place," he stated.

The big test of the regular season will be revealed April 8 on the home track against the University of Tennessee's "B" squad.

"We will really have to be up for one," stated Coach Talley. "Tennessee has a lot of depth and our securing the seven or eight firsts that I feel we can capture along with several seconds and thirds could give us the meet. But we will have to be ready."

The meet will be run against the Tennessee "B" team, which is the varsity team consisting of all men but the top three in each event.

Baseball Team Plays 10 Games; Are Now 3-0 In Conference

The Brevard Tornado baseball team had a heavy schedule over the holidays with 10 games being played. They won on March 20 against North Greenville 8-0 on the 2 hit pitching of Jim Dollyhigh. Jim struck out 14 and walked only 5. Danny Denton and Vic Sutherland led the nine hit offense with duplicate 2 for 5 performances. Both batted in 2, with Denton hitting a three - bagger.

On the 22 and 23, the Tornadoes traveled to Chapel Hill to play Carolina's freshmen. The first game saw Brevard drop a close 1-0 game. Steve Whitaker gave up only 4 hits, with the lone run being unearned. Brevard lost the second game 12-2, as 3 Tornado hurlers gave up 14 hits.

On the 27, Brevard defeated Brewton - Parker, Ga. 8 - 5 in the first game of their swing through that state. Vic Sutherland won in relief of Danny Denton. Sutherland, in 5 innings, struck out 8 and walked 4. Milton Harkey and Mike Zeugner each batted in 2 runs.

The next day, Brevard lost to South Georgia 3-2 on a balk. A single by Boland started the

Georgia rally. He stole second and third. Knight struck out, but reached first on the ball being dropped. Frank Jewell struck out Rinehart and Cason, but then the balk by the catcher Lemmonds allowed Boland to score.

Brevard lost on the 30 to Brewton - Parker 7 - 2. B. P. had a 12 hit attack against Ron Morgan and Taylor Moore.

The Georgia teams proved tougher as South Georgia defeated Brevard 8 - 2 and Middle Georgia won 5 - 3.

The Tornadoes stayed undefeated in conference play by winning a double - header at Anderson 4 - 2 and 5 - 3. The first game went 10 innings with Steve Whitaker going the distance. Steve scattered nine hits and struck out 15. Jim Dollyhigh pitched a 7 - hitter, striking out 11, in the second game. Danny Denton was one of the leading hitters with a 4-7

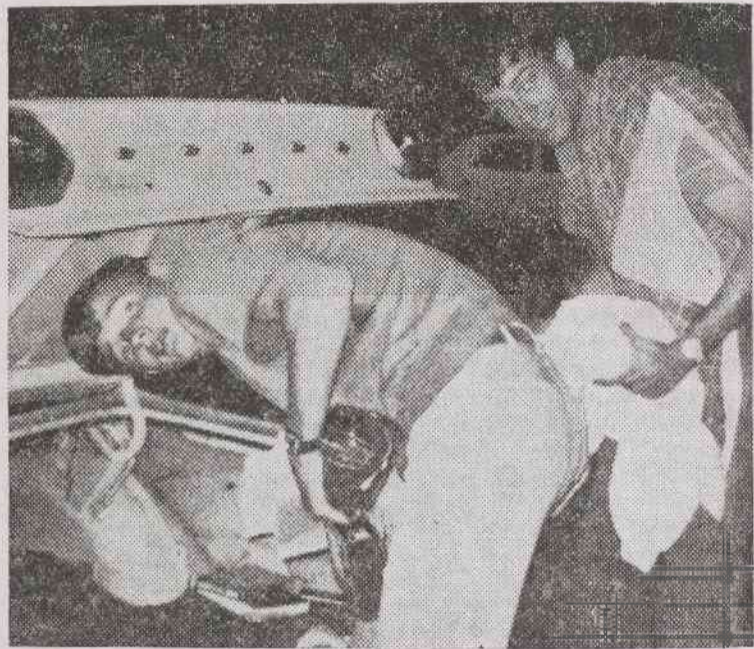
