"Music Showcase" Will Highlight Month

The department of music will sponsor three "Music Showcase" weekends during the month of March, which has been set aside for specific emphasis on music. The first of the series will be next weekend, March 14-16. A Brass Clinic by Emerson Head, trumpeter, will be here from the University of Maryland. The Asheville Symphony Orchestra will also present a concert. The second weekend will be March 21 - 23. An opera will be presented by the National Opera Company with Don Pasquale singing. There will also be an Ensemble Concert and Recital. A Formal Student Recital will be presented the third weekend, March 28 - 30. Voice and Clarinet and Chamber Music will be presented, and a Choral - Concert will also be conducted. During these three weekends special music will be sung in the local churches.

Bergman Film To Be Shown Saturday

Ingmar Bergman's film classic *The Magician* will be shown this Saturday night at 8:00, in Dunham Auditorium. This deeply startling work is a thinking man's horror film and a symbolic self - portrait of the famous director himself.

The film is the story of a traveling troupe led by Dr. Vogler, a hypnotist and magician. The troupe is traveling through the night toward 19th Century Stockholm. Vogler is accompanied by a witch of a grandmother, who makes love potions, and his wife, who is dressed as a male assistant. In the city they are examined and humiliated by a committee headed by a cynical medical officer.

The troupe puts on a special private performance for the medical officer and his committee. In order to stop them from amusing themselves at his expense, Vogler hypnotizes the chief constable's wife, and she tells of her amorous adventures. Vogler then hypnotizes a servant, who, when released from his trance, rushes at Vogler and kills him. The performance breaks up, and Vogler's assistants place his body in a coffin which is one of the props of the show, and carry him off.

The medical officer carries out an autopsy on the body. Then Vogler comes back from the dead and physically pursues the doctor through the house. Vogler has perpetrated an illusion on the unbelieving doctor, but is trapped by his own trick. He is rescued by messengers from the King who arrive to summon him to give a command performance at the palace.

Thus the wandering magician turns himself from a magician into a savior, then to a comedian, and finally to artist extraordinaire.

Max von Sydow, who played the knight in *The Seventh Seal*, is the leading character, and is supported by Bibi Anderson, Maria, in *The Seventh Seal* and famed actress, Ingrid Thulin.
