Tornadoes Down Gainesville For Fourth Win By 82-58

Brevard College's Tornadoes used an effective pressing manto-man defense and superior rebounding strength to roll to an 82-58 triumph Tuesday night over Gainesville College of Gainesville, Ga.

The Tornadoes outrebounded Gainesville, 48-29, despite Gainsville height advantage. The Bre-vard defense forced 15 turnovers.

Five players scored in double figures for the winners, with Bob Wolfe's 19 leading the attack. Chris Black had 25 for the losers.

Brevard hit on 38.4 per cent of its field goals and 69.9 from the line. The victory was the team's fourth against three setbacks. The Tornadoes go on final exam and Christmas break before returning to the hardwood, Jan. 5, at Montreat.




