

# Roadrunners Take Third Tennis Team Place In Florida Relays Opens Season

The Brevard College "Roadrunners," under the direction of Coach Norm Witek, placed a strong third at the Florida Relays held at Gainesville, Florida.

The track team pooled a total of 23 points in a field of 36 junior and freshmen college track teams. Taking first place in the meet with 22 points was Miami-Dade South. This team, due to the weather conditions in Miami, has already reached a peak in its performance ability.

Last year's Florida Relays showed the "Roadrunners" only scoring 15 points and Miami-Dade South compiling a winning total of 45. Last year's Brevard track team, later in the nationals, defeated the powerful Miami - Dade team.

A first place in the sprint medley running event went to the "Roadrunners." The sprint medley team consisted of Delmus Barfield, Clarence Thomas, Lennox Stewart and Reggie McAfee. McAfee, who anchored the medley race, ran the fastest 880 ever run by a Brevard College track member with a time of 1:51.8.

"Jumping" Ed Williams took

the only other Brevard first place at the Gainesville meet in the broad jump event with a distance of 22'9". Williams also placed second in the triple jump with a jump of 46' even.

Clarence Thomas, Don Goodspeed, Reg McAfee and Lennox Stewart placed second in the mile relay with a combined team time of 3:22:1.

The track team's next meet will be held April 7 at Lees McRae.

The 1971 Brevard tennis team opened its season last Thursday afternoon with a 5-2 loss to conference opponent Montreat Anderson. This year's small, five man team consists of four sophomores and one freshman. The squad members are Phil Hess, Mike Faggart, Ernie Sewell, Lyndon Ashworth, and freshman Stuart Bowers. All but Ashworth and Bowers played for the Tornados last season.

Phil Hess, playing as number one man for Brevard, won his singles match giving the Tornados their only victory in the singles competition. Later Hess joined up with Stuart Bowers to capture a double match. Bowers and Sewell also played close singles matches before losing.

The Tornados next home match will be held this afternoon as they take on Wingate, last year's conference champion. Wingate, a perennial tennis powerhouse, finished as one of the top three junior college tennis teams in the nation last year. Come out and support the team.

# Professor Charles R. Adams Named To Prestigious Association

The Board of Governors of the International Platform Association announce the election to its membership of Charles R. Adams, Assistant Professor of Biology at Brevard College.

The International Platform Association is a non-partisan organization of distinguished and dedicated persons from fifty-five nations. Its ancestor, the American Lyceum Association out of which the IPA evolved, was founded one hundred fifty years ago by Daniel Webster. Recognized at the beginning of the century by Mark Twain, William Jennings Bryan, Carl Sandburg, President Howard Taft, Governor Paul Pearson, Theodore Roosevelt,

and other orators and celebrities of the old Chautauqua, the IPA has included among its members most of the U. S. presidents since Theodore Roosevelt, including Mr. Nixon and his two predecessors.

Its present membership lists may celebrities of the press, TV, radio, movies, and the theater as well as a leavening of those who listen, who are interested in furthering IPA's objectives.

For more than two generations, IPA members have been instrumental in improving the quality of the American Platform, particularly as it relates to the important field of assembly programs available to

school children.

Every summer the IPA holds a five-day convention in Washington, D. C. Last summer some fourteen hundred members attended. The most pressing national and international problems of the day are presented by nationally prominent figures (most of them NPA members) who, because they hold the levers of power, are in the best position to argue informally on one or the other side of every question.

The IPA is the club and trade association of those who appear before audiences in all media and of those interested in oratory and the power of the spoken word.

Among those who have appeared before our last few conventions are U.S. Attorney General Mitchell, Atomic Energy Commission Chairman Glenn Seaborg, Lowell Thomas, Lyndon Johnson, Congressman Gerald Ford, Jeane Dixon, Hubert Humphrey, Governor Nelson Rockefeller, Secretary of Housing and Urban Development George Romney, Mayor Lindsay, Senator Muskie, Martin Luther King, Senator Barry Goldwater, Senator Hugh Scott, and Ralph Nader.
