The patrolling of the men's dormitories (by the dean) shows a definite lack of confidence and trust in the students. the relief meal for those who go through the left line.

This is an opportunity to show you really care for other people. Last week Furman University raised over \$700.00 in a similar program. Let's see what Brevard can do! The relief program is being co-ordinated on the Brevard campus by the Baptist Student Union, aided by the Christian Council, Canterbury Club, and Westminster Fellowship. Talk this up in your dorms, organizations, etc. Faculty, please encourage participation in your classrooms. Let's make Tuesday, December 10th a day to be remembered at Brevard College showing we have students and adults who put action in providing food for starving people.
