### Fund Improvements

Now that the new semester has begun the students at B. C. are faced with that ever present thorn in the side...FINES. One of the most frequent question asked during this "fine" time is, "where does it all go?"

I decided that the best place to start to find the answer to this question would be with Dean Houk. She then gave me a very informative explanation of the system.

When a student pays a fine, the money is divided in half. One half of the money goes to the student loan fund and the other goes for dorm improvements.

The student loans are distributed to students who apply for them for personal emergencies or simply for a weekend trip. The time at which the loan must be paid back is decided by Dean Houk and the student.

Dorm improvements include the "luxuries" that a dorm receives. An example of the improvements is the ice machine in East Beam. Both of these programs were set up for the benefits of the students. Dean Houk also expressed that she hoped next year it could be set up on a 70-30 basis in which 70% would go for dorm improvements.

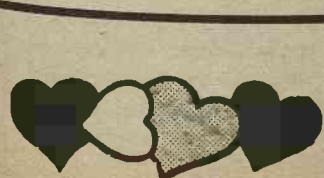
