There have been three significant changes in the administration and faculty of Brevard College. Mr. Don Scarborough who came to Brevard in 1978 from Asheville Country Day, (a private high school), is now the new Dean of Student Affairs. In the past, Mr. Scarborough held positions as resident tutor, soccer and women's basketball coach, head of student activities, and physical education instructor.
