The 1982 edition of WHO'S WHO AMONG STUDENTS IN AMERICAN JUNIOR COLLEGES will carry the names of twelve students from Brevard College who have been selected as being among the country's most outstanding campus leaders.

B.C.'s Don Scarborough Named Region 10 Coach of the Year

Don A. Scarborough, head soccer coach at Brevard College, has been named Coach of the Year of the National Junior College Athletic Association Region X. Scarborough was chosen by vote of the Region X coaches and was their unanimous selection.

Brevard College finished its year with a 10-8-2 record and competed against such teams as Duke University, Wake Forest University, the University of South Carolina and NAIA top 20 powers Berry College and Cove-

nant College. Brevard ended its season with a 1-0 loss in the NJCAA Southeastern Sectional Tournament to undefeated Andrew College after three overtimes.

Scarborough led the Tornados to championships in the Brevard College Invitational Tournament, NJCAA Region X regular season and post-season tournament. The Tornados were undefeated at home and were undefeated and

unscored upon in regional competition.

Scarborough has recently been awarded an "A" license for coaching soccer by the United States Soccer Federation. The "A" license is the highest certification issued by the USSF. Only 250 coaches have been awarded this level of recognition in the United States and Scarborough is the only coach in Western North Carolina to have earned the license "A."
