

# Track Season Opens On Good Foot

The Brevard College track team opened its indoor season January 16, in a tri-meet at Virginia Tech against the hosts and Appalachian State. Even though it was a non-scoring meet on the part of Virginia Tech and Brevard, the performances were still great.

Two freshmen, Andy Latimer and Willie Holeman, qualified for the Junior College Nationals in Champagne, Illinois, on March 5 and 6, in the triple jump and the long jump, respectively. Their qualifying lengths were 47'8" for

Latimer and 23'1/2" for Holeman. Other bright spots were Paul Brim, a freshman from Greensboro, NC, in the 1500 meters, Andy Latimer in the high jump, Dan Clay in the 5000 meters, and Gerald Hutchinson in the 5000 and 3000 meters.

There are three first semester freshmen on the Brevard track team. Al Winebarger runs the 1000 meters, Gordon Snaden runs the 3000 meters and Jeff Dorman runs the high hurdles. Dorman, who is uneligible to represent Brevard, ran unattached in the meet and his time of 7:6 would have normally qualified him for the National Championships.
