Frampton studied music at Erskine College and the Cincinnati

Conservatory. His first musical accomplishment came in 1969 when he received a bronze medal in the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition.

In the past few years, Frampton and his group have given almost 600 concerts in the United States, Canada, and the Near East. His concert at Brevard should prove to be an enjoyable and entertaining experience for all who attend.

Christian Encounter Week, March 7-11, will be an exciting week of spiritual growth, renewal, and commitment for B.C. students. The theme for the week will be "Finding Hope In A Fatalistic Age." Dr. Harold C. Warlick, Jr., Director of Ministerial Studies at Harvard University Divinity School, will be the guest speaker.

Among the activities planned is a series of four lectures which will be presented by Dr. Warlick. Two of the lectures may be counted toward credit for Humanities 101-102. The lectures are a part of the Thomas F. Staley Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecture Program, which is designed to strengthen the

small Christian college. The schedule for the Staley lectures, all of which will be presented in Dunham Auditorium, is as follows:

Sunday, March 7, 7:30 p.m. "But the Rarest of These is Hope"

Monday, March 8, 7:30 p.m. "Something To Hold To"

Tuesday, March 9, 7:30 p.m. "Going the First Mile"

Wednesday, March 10, 10:00 a.m. "Humankind: The Summation of Creation"

Some of the other activities planned include a special dinner in Dr. Warlick's honor on Sunday in the private dining room, a reception after Dr. Warlick's lecture on Sunday at which the Big Sisters will serve, and special music before the first lecture.

Also, Dr. Warlick will attend Dr. Roy's sociology class on Monday morning at 8:00 a.m.

Dr. Warlick earned a B.A. degree from Furman University, a S.T.B. degree from Harvard University Divinity School, and his D.Min. degree from Vanderbilt University Divinity School. In 1975, he received a counseling certificate from the University of

Miami School of Medicine. Dr. Warlick has served as Senior Minister of the Seventh and James Baptist Church in Waco, Texas, and as pastor of Trinity Baptist Church in Seneca, South Carolina. The four books he has written are titled Liberation From Guilt, Sketches of Creative Living: Sermons Which Tell a Story, Conquering Loneliness, and Sermons for Easter.

The college students in the chorus will sing some short Renaissance pieces and southern folk hymns. Soloists on the program will be Sarah Seawell, Wayne Bishop, and Edgar Evans.

Birds of Prey

A special wildlife lecture on "Birds of Prey" will be presented by Mr. Pete Conroy at Brevard College on Wednesday, March 3 from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. in the Dunham Auditorium.

Conroy, director of the Raptor Institute at Furman University and President of the Greenville Audubon Society, is a very active guest lecturer in the North and South Carolina area. His public service announcements ("Wildlife with Pete Conroy") on

WFBC-TV in Greenville are shown daily in a four-state viewing audience.

Conroy will be presenting a short slide program, models, demonstrations, and several live birds of prey (injured birds undergoing rehabilitation) as part of this general introductory lecture.
