

On October 27, the Brevard College cross country team defeated the University of Tennessee JV's by a score of 20-43 and the University of North Carolina at Charlotte 19-44 for its 47th and 48th consecutive victories. The team has not lost a dual or triangular meet since 1977.

Brevard put together another fine team effort as only 21 seconds separated the top five runners. The Roadrunners were led by Glenn Roach who finished 3rd with a time of 25:04. Roach was followed closely by teammates Patrick O'Grady, who finished 5th with a time of 25:14 Charlie Purser, who finished 6th with a time of 25:16; Henning Brandt, who finished 7th with a time of 25:22; Winston Brown, who finished 8th with a time of 25:25; Rodney Curry, who finished 9th with a time of 25:36; and David Coulter, who finished 11th with a time of 25:50. These seven men will represent the Roadrunners in the National Championships in Twin Falls, Idaho, on-November 10.

Brevard College is currently ranked number one in the junior college cross country rankings.


