"Many students, guys and girls alike, are wearing ones (jeans) that look like they have had them since 7th grade," said John Haag, a freshman.

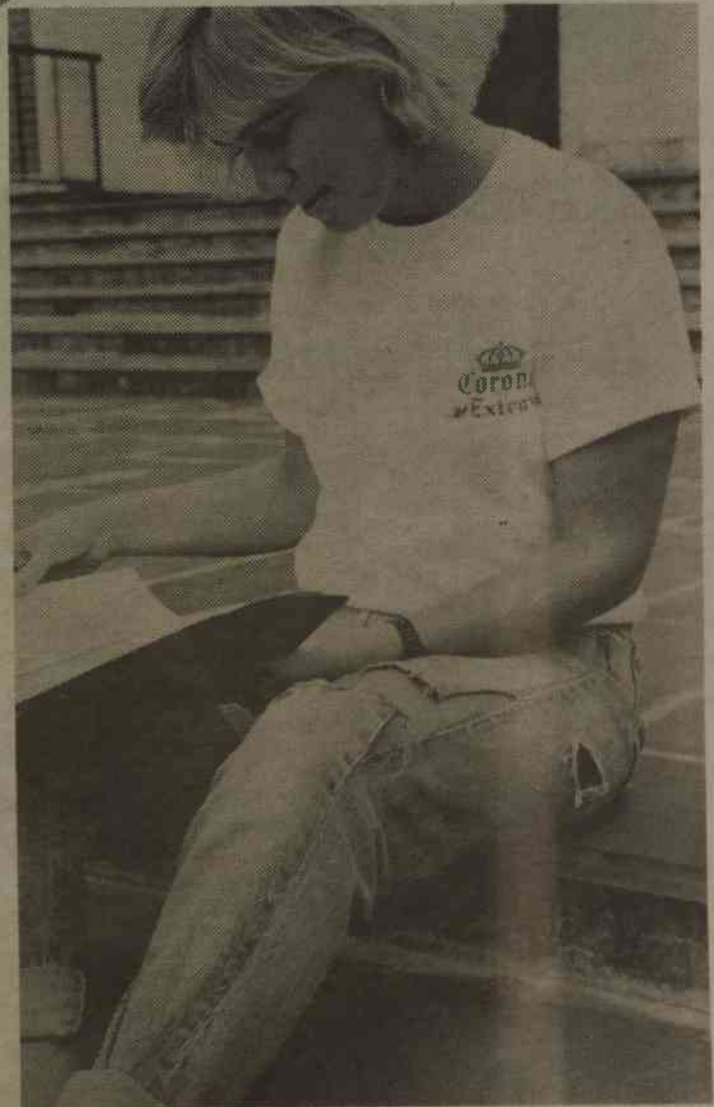
