Gash is a former employee of Brevard College. Witek said Gash's motives were unclear.

The victim said she woke up, yelled for her suitemates and she then ran into their room, called her RD in West Beam, who called security guard Guy Jarvis, who quickly appeared on the scene with Dean Witek.
