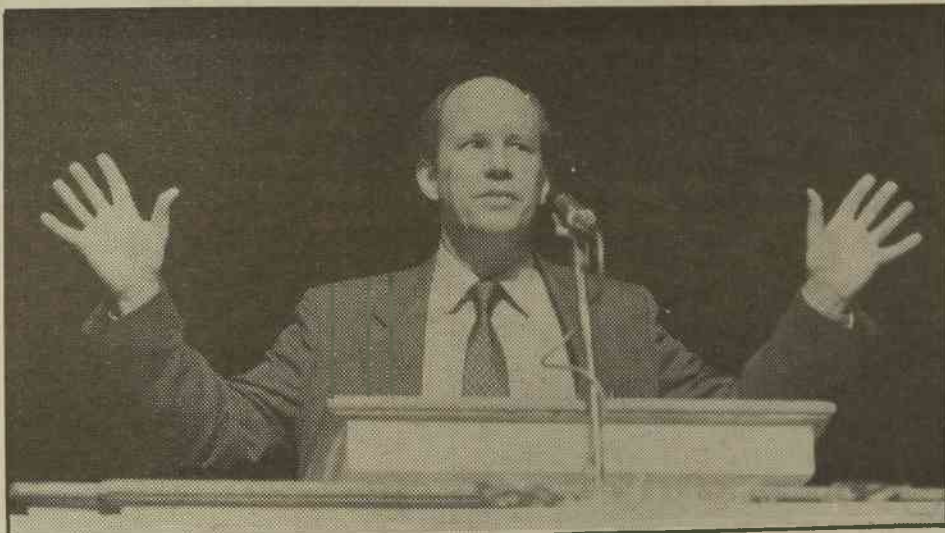

## See the 'big picture' says jazzman Howard Hanger

"See the big picture ... live in that big  
picture." That was the message from  
Reverend Howard Hanger at Brevard's  
1988 Spring Convocation held in Dunham  
Auditorium on January 27.

Phi Theta Kappa members ushered in  
Brevard's faculty and were later recogniz-  
ed by Dean of the College, Dr. Harry  
Langley. Induction for new PTK members  
was held later the same evening.

Dr. Charles Zimmerman, Brevard Col-  
lege Chaplain, gave the invocation and  
President Greer welcomed everyone to the  
service.

Guest speaker Rev. Hanger, who is  
Director of Special Ministries at Central  
United Methodist Church in Asheville, is  
also the leader of the Howard Hanger Jazz  
Fantasy, which includes Elliott Wadopian  
on bass and Earl Hefley on saxophone.  
Hanger and his group played three  
numbers at the ceremony, much to the au-  
dience's approval.

Hanger, who studied at Emory Universi-  
ty and the Candler School of Theology, had  
a challenging message for students. He en-  
couraged students to work and develop, to  
learn to work together and to take risks.  
Hanger said education is "helping you see  
the picture" of life and it's up to each in-  
dividual to choose to "live in that big pic-  
ture."

Hanger's presentation was accented  
with performances by the trio of such  
songs as "Hill Street Blues" and "Take  
Five."

With Hanger's piano, Wadopian's bass,  
and Hefley's sax, the ceremony was  
definitely one of Brevard's most unusual.

Hanger presented the trio's new album,  
"Cool Morning Air," to Dr. Greer, and Dr.  
Zimmerman offered the benediction.

Other special music was provided by  
The Collegiate Singers and the Brevard  
College Brass Quintet.
