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Heat up the Cold Winter season with hot campus fashions at Brevard College. A variety of fashions are flaunted everyday; however, what are clothes really about?

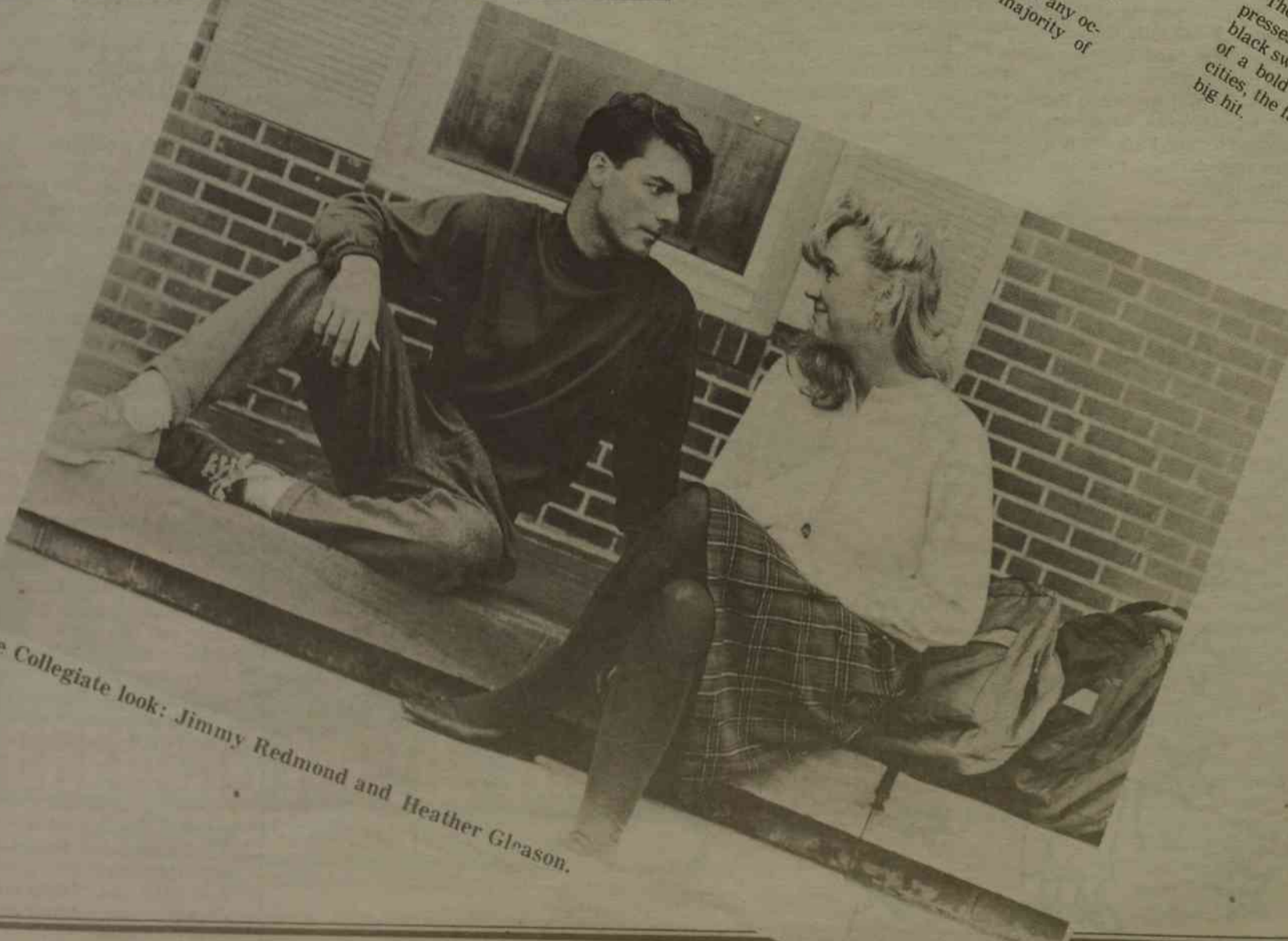
