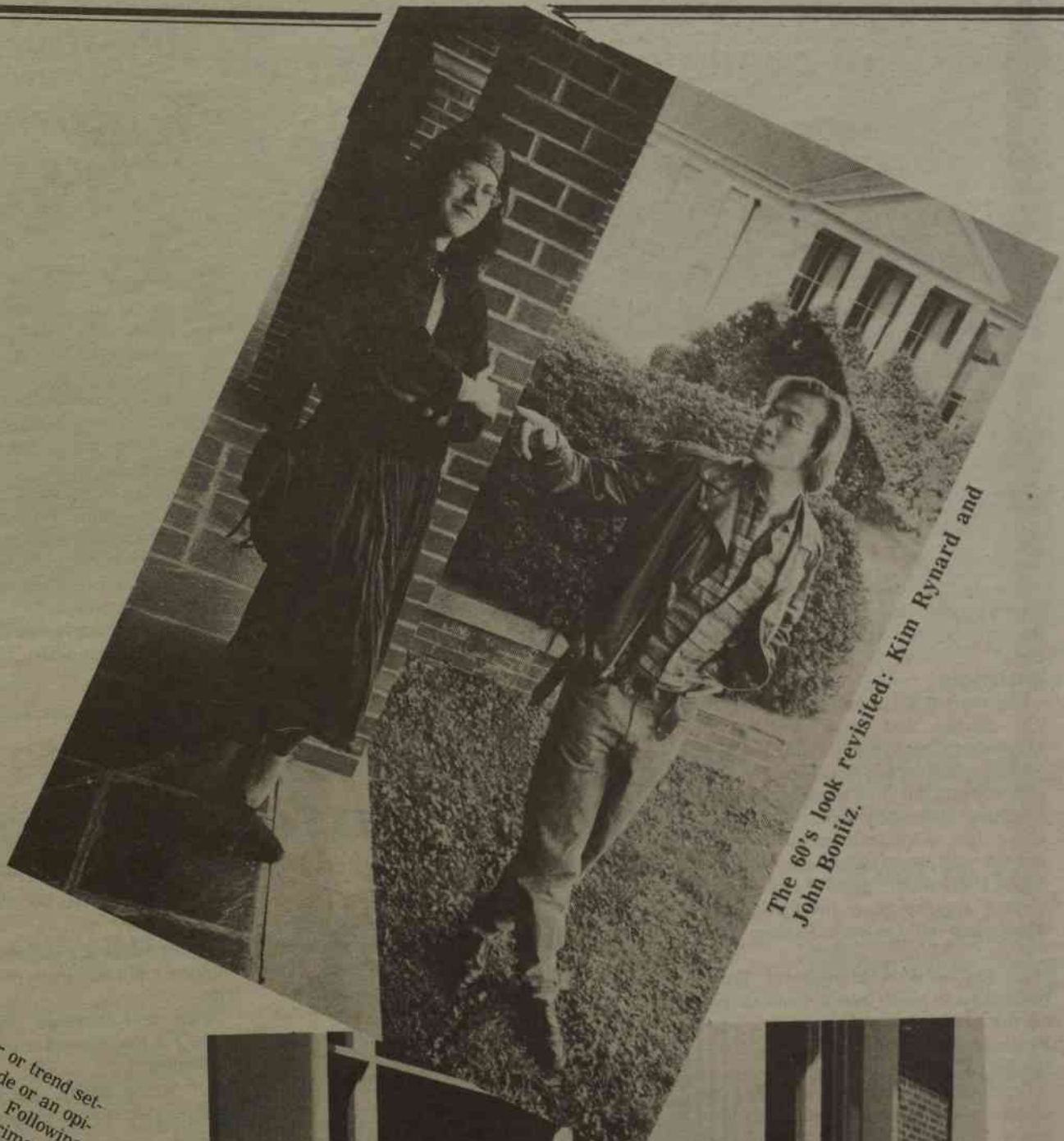


# us fashions: flamboyance!
