"STATE vs. GARRISON" SET FOR THE 26th

Brevard College's Dunham Auditorium will be the site for the second annual staging of the Mock Rape Trial, beginning at 7 p.m., Weds., Sept. 26.

"State vs. Garrison" will reveal the difficulties encountered in prosecuting a case of acquaintance rape in a college setting. The "script," which is a guide for improvisation rather than an actual script, is supplied by Blue Earth County Human Services of Mankato, Minn., and will be reworked by BC Campus Nurse Barbara White to apply to Brevard College.

The Mock Rape Trial has been staged with great success at Mankato State University, Minn., at Guilford College in Greensboro, N.C., and here at BC last year.

The performance is designed to sensitize the audience to the problem of sexual violence while also educating them on the workings of the criminal justice system. The play is unique in that the cast must answer impromptu questions, merely using their character profiles as a base from which to respond.

A jury will be selected at random from the audience and will be charged with reaching a verdict after reviewing the arguments and the evidence.

"State vs. Garrison" is co-sponsored by Student Health Services and the Student Government Association. The judge for the Mock Rape Trial is Hon. Robert S. Cilley, District Court Judge for the 29th District. The prosecuting attorney will be Transylvania County Assistant District Attorney, William J. Cathey III. The attorney for the defense will be played by Brevard attorney William R. White. BC Public Safety Officer and RD Greg Dill will play the bailiff.

Main cast members in the Mock Rape Trial include: Jenny, played by SGA Vice President Joyea Warren, who is to claim that Mark, played by RA Derrick Briggs, assaulted her against her will. Other cast members include: Angela Williams as the detective, and students Anna Paez, Jeff Yellen, Brian Mendenhall, RA Mary Wise, and BC staff member Lin Redmond as witness and friend. Transylvania Community Hospital Nurse Practitioner Juanita Butterworth will play the doctor. An additional player is needed to fill the part of the pastor.

A panel will be on hand while the jury deliberates to elaborate and answer questions on the causes and effects of rape. That panel will consist of Steve Woodson, Sally Farmer of the Hendersonville Rape Crisis Center, and Cynthia Shaffer of the Buncombe County Rape Crisis Center.

This mock trial will be a portrayal and not an actual trial. Those participating in it are actors and therefore possess no real personal involvement in any actual or similar issues. Any similarity to any individual or institution is unintentional.
