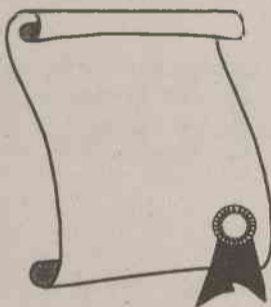

## McClendon named VP of Institutional Advancement

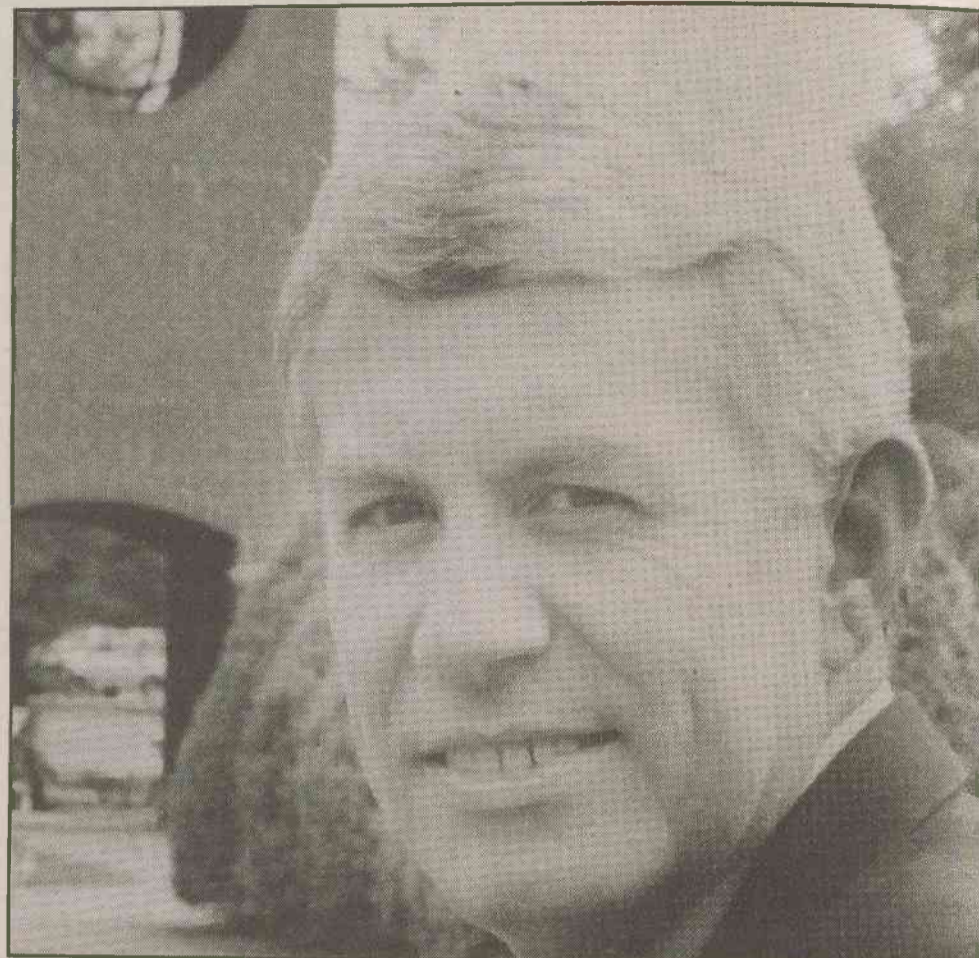
